YARD GATES CLOSED AT 9:30AM - DO NOT OPEN!

Please note that yard supervision ends when the bell rings at 9:30 a.m. At this time the gates will be closed and any student arriving past 9:30 a.m. should report to the main office as per the Safe Schools Act. Opening the gates after this time not only sends your own student into an unsupervised area but you also risk other students exiting the property without supervision. Failure to follow this procedure can result in unattended and/or missing students for safe arrival. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our Harvest Hills students safe.

HOW EMAILING AHEAD HELPS WITH EARLY DISMISSALS

- The office cannot dismiss students who are out on a community walk with their class. By messaging in ad-• vance the teacher can plan to return to the school for pick up time or make alternate arrangements for the student to stay back with another class.
- Students spend time in many different areas of our school such as the gym, library, visits to other classrooms and the general purpose room for activities like music. By notifying the office of an early pick up the teacher can ensure your student will have all of their belongs with them and the office can locate the student easily once you arrive.
- Teachers can make sure that the student has enough time to clean up any projects they are working on before you arrive and where possible teachers can plan classroom activities with consideration to the student leaving early (i.e. tests and presentations).
- The office can notify supply teachers in the event your classroom teacher is absent.
- The office can notify you if your planned arrival time is during recess. Students are with duty teachers during the breaks and it can be difficult to locate them.

EXTENDED ABSENCES FOR TRIPS/VACATIONS -URGENT

We often have several families leave for extended vacations during the school year. It is mandatory to let the school know in advance via email at harvesthills@scdsb.on.ca of student absences due to extended travel/trips. Please do not send these notifications to the homeroom teachers, the office will advise them as necessary. This is part of the Safe Schools program in conjunction with the Safe Arrival Program.



If the email is sent to the teachers and they are not here, the student will be marked absent unknown, and safe arrival calls will go out to you and all the emergency contacts you provided until we know that the student is safe. If there is no reply from parents/guardians/emergency contacts because you are out of the country, the school may have to contact South Simcoe Police to perform a wellness check. This is a board procedure to ensure the safety of all our students.

For absences of 1-14 days, the office will update the student attendance as required. **Please note** that if a student is absent for 15 or more consecutive days, in accordance with the Simcoe County District School Board, we must take them off our enrollment roster and re-enroll them when they return. This is per the Government of Ontario Ministry of Education guidelines.

The Ministry will make exceptions if your student will be absent 15+ days due to medical procedures or serious illness if documentation is provided by the accredited Physician treating the student.

Provided the office receives notice before your student leaves for the extended absence, the office will coordinate the paperwork required here on site to demit and then re-admit your student without parents/guardians having to register their student online all over again. If you do not provide notice before leaving, you will be required to register your student upon your return via the board website as you did when your student first attended a Simcoe County school.

Where possible we will attempt to place your student in the same class when they return but we cannot guarantee this placement due to ongoing registrations and Ministry of Education class caps.

There is no asynchronous learning available during extended travel, this was an emergency measure for Covid 19 only.

NOTE: French Immersion students who are withdrawn for 15+ days absences will lose their placement in the French Immersion program. The student will then have to return to their home school in Bradford (based on your home address) to continue in the regular English stream if and until a space opens again. Parent/Guardians may apply to the French Immersion Program waitlist before they leave by contacting the school office in such cases.

REMINDER WE ARE SCENT FREE!!

If you are visiting the school please make sure to be Scent Free. We have several individuals in the building with allergies and asthma.

STUDENT LUNCHES

Please make sure to send your child's lunch and snacks to school with them in the morning. No fast-food lunches are to be dropped off for students







Harvest Hills is a Nut Aware, Shell Fish Aware & Scent Free school. Please refrain from bringing any products containing nuts and/or shell fish to the school and from wearing any scents. We have staff and students that are greatly affected and may have anaphylaxis reactions. Thank you.



SCHOOL ACCESS INFORMATION 2023-2024

Please send students with lunch and all items they need for the day in the morning when leaving home. There will be limited staff to answer the door for forgotten items between 9:30 am–3:50pm. School doors are locked as per the SCDSB Safe School Policy.

Please ensure your students have plenty of lunch, snacks, water and extra clothing in their backpacks for washroom accidents and come prepared with proper clothing for the weather (ie. mittens, hats, ect). Thank you for your assistance as we strive to keep our students and staff safe and healthy.

If your student needs to be signed out, we ask that you send an email to the office in advance <u>har-</u> <u>vesthills@scdsb.on.ca</u>. PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL or MES-SAGE the teachers directly because the office will not receive your messages if they are not at school that day, the office will advise the teacher. Once you arrive at the school, please ring the front doorbell and we will call your student down and a staff member will then escort the student to the front doors for the parent/guardian. Photo identification, as always, will be required to pickup a student from Harvest Hills.

SIGN UP WITH SCHOOLCASH ONLINE

School Cash Online is now the board system for all permission forms, school forms with no fees and purchases. Whether it's lunch days, field trips or school wear, we have it online for you!

Follow these three steps to get started:

- 1. Go to simcoecounty.schoolcashonline.com or visit our school website and click on 'Pay Fees'
- 2. Register and add your student to the newly created account
- 3. View and purchase items through bank transfer or credit card

PARKING LOT



Our parking lots are very busy especially at arrival and dismissal time. For everyone's safety, we encourage parents to have students in the bus areas to please take the bus to and from school daily. Walking students walk to and from school daily.

Please do not park out front of the school on Crossland Boulevard as per the town of Bradford West Gwillimbury. South Simcoe Police Serviced and Bylaw officers have been monitoring and ticketing this area.

The WEST parking lot is for school buses and staff only. Only school vehicles (school buses and vans) or emergency vehicles (ambulances/Police cars) are allowed in the school bus loading zone that is in the WEST parking lot.

The EAST parking has the **designated** student pick-up and drop-off. The lot may have some parking spaces open when you arrive for pickup and drop off other than the dedicated accessible parking spots (which can only be used by those with legal permits). If



you arrive before 9:15am to drop off your students, please park in open parking spaces. If you arrive early at dismissal, please follow the same process of parking where spaces are open. **Please keep the pick-up and drop-off lane moving**.

SAFE ARRIVAL

If your student will be absent/late, please call the school's safe arrival line at **1-888-885-8065**. Leave a message with your student's name (spelling the last name), teacher/ grade, and date of absence and the reason for the absence. This is a

24-hour service where a message must be left if your student will be absent or late.

OR email absences to hhlattendance@scdsb.on.ca. If your student is absent for 3 or more consecutive days, please send a note to the office. PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL or MESSAGE the teachers directly because the office will not receive your messages if they are not at school that day.
